Sectional Information

- 1. At the state meeting on Friday, the state voted to make the number of meets needed to compete in the sectionals, state qualifier, and states for Section V to <u>four</u> meets.
- 2. If an athlete has a medical hardship, a hardship entry must be submitted to Kathy Hoyt, Section V Executive Director by Friday, February 8. The form in found on the Section V Web Site under documents.
- 3. Entries for the Sectionals are due By Sunday, February 10 at 8:00.
- 4. <u>Verification sheets are due by February 11</u>. They may be mailed, faxed to Penfield High School, emailed to me, (Dave Hennessey) or brought to the seeding meeting.
- 5. The seeding meeting is on Monday, February 11 at 7:00 at Penfield High School. It will take place in "The Commons" the cafeteria near the small parking lot found on the right as you enter the Penfield property. Provisional athletes may be scratched at that meeting, automatic may not.
- 6. At the Sectional meeting, schools will be allowed to sign up for jobs at the sectionals. These will be the same jobs for those schools at the state qualifier.
- 7. For this meet, we will use the scratch rule, similar to outdoor. The athlete must report to the event, but does NOT have to compete. It does count as one of their events, so an athlete could not be in four individual events with the intention of not doing one at the sectionals.
- 8. Admission for all spectators is \$ 5.00. Only Section V passes or State Passes will be accepted.
- 9. Following the class meets, please email Dave Yen your votes for the MVP Track and MVP Field Events in your class. These awards will be given at the State Qualifier.

State Qualifier Information

- 1. <u>Entries are due on **Sunday, February 17 by 8:00**</u>. A list of athletes entered will be posted. <u>Final scratch deadline is noon on Wednesday.</u>
- 2. <u>To make scratches, contact Dave Yen directly</u>, do not go into your account to make changes, they will not be picked up.
- 3. An athlete who scratches or checks in but does not compete on the day of the meet in any event will be done for the remainder of the meet.
- 4. The top two individuals and the winning relay go automatically to the state meet. The third place finisher in the 300, 600, 1000, and 1500/1600 will go in the intersectional medley relay. The third place finisher and the second place relay will also go to the state meet if they have met a standard. In the case of the 300,600, 1000, and 1500/1600 the fourth place finisher would then go if the third place finisher qualifies in an individual event.
- 5. Medals will be given to the top three finishers. We have a victory stand, and we would like the coach of the winning athlete to present that athlete or relay their medal(s).
- 6. The bus to the state meet will leave on Thursday afternoon on February 28.
